## Easter Celebration!

Dear Friends,

We have quite an Easter celebration planned at OPPC! Of course, our main focus is to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. So our worship will be full of the joy and hope that his new life offers us. Greg Holton and I will be leading a 7:00 a.m. Sunrise Easter service at Moosehaven. Then we plan to have bag pipes Easter morning during both of our regular on-campus services. The piper will also play outside during our out-of-doors tent reception.

For the reception we ask that you bring a generous supply of the following type items to share: fruit, pastries, bagels, breakfast casseroles, devil eggs, doughnuts, etc. Also during the reception we will have a short ground-breaking ceremony.

Why a ground-breaking ceremony? Because we will commence with the renovation of our sanctuary first floor (a.k.a. basement/catacombs) the following morning (April 25<sup>th</sup>). All of your generous financial giving to our capital campaign, and our campus development planning, are finally beginning to pay off with the first of two renovation phases. The Fellowship Hall will be renovated later this year.

It's quite symbolic, on Easter morning, to celebrate bringing new life to our catacombs. Catacombs are, of course, ancient graveyards. That's where the dead were buried. And since Jesus rose from the dead it's appropriate that we celebrate the resurrection of that space. It will bring new life to our church through its use for discipleship ministries.

All of the above is happening Easter morning, alone! Shew... I'm tired just thinking about it. And don't forget that, prior to Easter day, we have a plethora of Holy Week services and events: Maundy Thursday dinner (6:30 p.m.) and service (7:30 p.m.), Good Friday service (7:30 p.m.), Friday prayer vigil (10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.), and the Saturday "Spring Fling" at Moosehaven (9:45 a.m.).

As I said, we have quite an Easter celebration planned at OPPC. The best part of all is that the living Lord, Jesus Christ, is alive for us, in us, and through us. That's why we are called the body of Christ. And so, let us give thanks and praise and glory and honor to our Lord by how we live & grow as his body here in Orange Park, Florida.

**OPPC FINANCES**

*THANK YOU, to all of you who have re-evaluated your pledge, submitted a pledge card, contributed to the 2nd Mile Giving or Matching Gift programs and for everything else you do to contribute to the operating budget.*

*When we projected the figures for 2011 for the 'Worship Plus Two' catalogue, we projected total revenue of \$551,600 and expenses of \$564,224. This was a \$12,000+ deficit. However, when I presented the 2011 Budget to the Session for approval, I was able to provide them one where we were showing revenue of \$567,300 and expenses of \$567,585.05. A \$285.05 deficit!!! But the Business & Finance ministry team is not ready to sit back and relax. We are going to be working with the other ministry teams to review how they can generate revenue not*

only for their ministry but to contribute to the overall operating budget. We have things we are already looking into; for example Planned Giving, Endowments/Designated Giving. You can also get your taxes done with the assistance of our bookkeeper, Krystle Hoard, for a minimal charge/contribution. If you have other ideas that can assist us to meet the needs of our church to continue all of our wonderful mission opportunities, ministry teams, etc. please let Kris Mattson ([kris.mattson@citi.com](mailto:kris.mattson@citi.com)) know.

## LIFE GROUPS

**I would like to share with you the advantages of being in a Life Group.**

**People use their gifts and talents to minister to one another,** God doesn't expect pastors and teachers to do all the ministering. He has given each of us gifts and talents to encourage, teach and challenge one another. Life Groups provide the perfect setting for Christians to minister one to another.

*And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds (Hebrews 10:24).*

**Life Group members encourage each other in their faith.** We strengthen each other's faith. In his letter to the Romans, Paul taught us that when we see the faith in another believer, it encourages us in our own faith.

*... that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith (Romans 1:12).*

**Life Group members encourage each other to grow.** Regardless of a group's focus or format, after a while people are likely to share personal insights and testimonies. When people share, other group members see new ways they can draw closer to God and new steps they can take with others. Changing is hard. There is nothing like a word of encouragement when someone feels hopeless or discouraged. Group members support one another, both during meetings and outside them.

*We can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God (2 Corinthians 1:4).*

**Members pray for one another.** God honors and answers prayer. When people become connected emotionally, they are more open to praying for one another. Often, group members exchange prayer requests or become prayer partners.

*For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them (Matthew 18:20).*

**Group members can help each other in hard times.** People often feel isolated, alone or abandoned when facing grave health, emotional or financial problems. Small group members can provide a "safety net," supporting one another in hard times.

### **Friendships start.**

Many people, including Christians, lack close friends. When people get together in a Life Group, close friendships form and are strengthened.
